
OTTO YOUNG DEAD.

Chicago Merchant and Financier Dies
at His Wisconsin Home.

CHICAGO, Ill., Nov. 30.—Otto Young, one of the leading financiers of this city, died to-day at his home at Lake Geneva, Wis. He was a Director in several banks, and was one of the largest holders of real estate in Chicago.

Otto Young was born in Eberfeld, Germany, on Dec. 20, 1844. He came to the United States in 1859, and for six years was a clerk in one of the leading stores in this city. He then filled a position in a mercantile house in New Orleans, and in 1872 went to Chicago.

Arriving there he started in the wholesale jewelry business under the firm name of Otto Young & Co. He gradually became interested in many of the financial houses of that city. He owned a half-interest in "The Fair," a large department store, and was Secretary and Treasurer of that concern until it was sold out in July, 1905.

Mr. Young was a member of the Union League and Chicago Athletic Clubs.
